A Message from the Fire Chief



The Fire Division provides fire prevention and suppression, emergency medical, community Paramedicine, technical rescue, and hazardous materials mitigation services. The City is served by one engine/rescue unit, one ladder truck (Quint) and three medic units, operating from two station locations. The division responds to approximately 5,500 incidents each year.

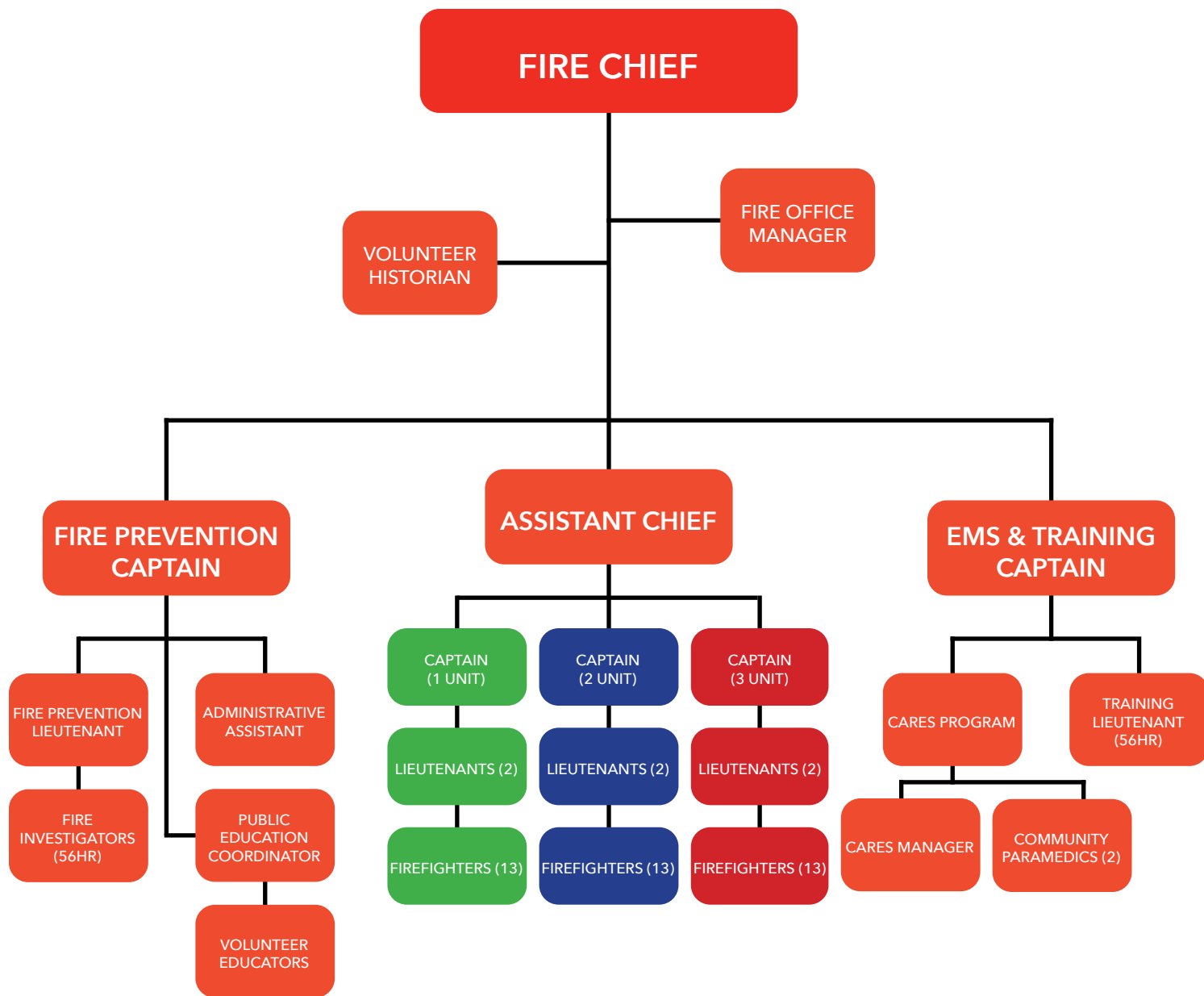
The Fire Division is staffed by 55 sworn personnel, with services delivered by 9 officers and 39 firefighters and paramedics over three 24-hour shifts, in partnership with an administrative team that includes the Fire Chief, Assistant Fire Chief, the Fire Prevention Office, EMS/Training Office, and administrative support staff.

Each year, fire personnel undergo live fire and rescue training exercises, continuing education to maintain firefighting, EMT, paramedic and inspection certifications, and field exercises as part of a regional hazardous materials team.

The division provides a variety of health and safety programs, which includes fire safety education and public speaking engagements.

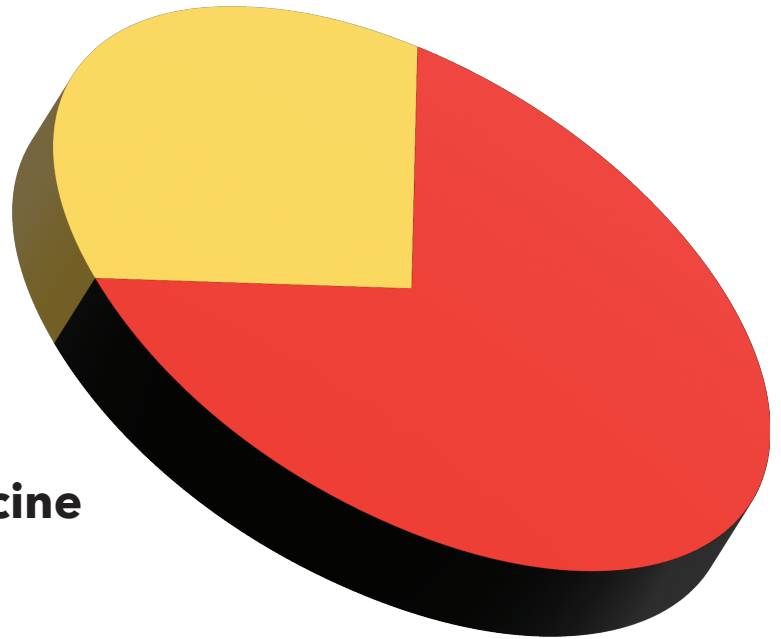
