Deadline for receiving Senior Options home delivered meals extended to September 1, 2020.

Any Franklin County resident 60 or over who is struggling to access food while sheltering in place is eligible to receive home delivered meals.

Now through September 1, 2020, Franklin County Senior Options will not require income verification to receive home delivered meals. To request meals, and other available services, call Senior Options at 614-525-6200, Monday to Friday, 9 am to 4:30 pm.

Franklin County Senior Options is a levy funded program administered by the Franklin County Office on Aging and helps Franklin County residents 60 and older maintain their independence. It also supports family members with the often-overwhelming task of caring for a frail older parent, family member, or friend with limited abilities.

Senior options has been providing community-based services since 1993. These services can include home-delivered meals, homemaker services, personal care, respite care, adult day care, emergency response systems and minor home repair.

Tax Aide Options

Adult Swim Only (at Devon Pool, effective July 13)

Monday & Wednesday from 7-9 pm Tuesday & Thursday from 11:30 am-1:30 pm

Our pools are open only to Upper Arlington Residents this season since we have to limit the amount of patrons at the pool at one time due to COVID-19. Visit the Aquatics webpage for Guidelines and FAQs and how to purchase a ticket online.

Open Swim is also available in two-hour sessions at both Devon and Tremont Pools, with a capacity limit of 125 people per session for each location. There is a 30-minute break between each session for cleaning and disinfection.

Because of the modified format, season passes cannot be purchased since customers will not have unlimited access to the facility. Residents must purchase a ticket for each session they wish to attend, with a limit of one session per day per person. Because of the limit capacity, sessions are only available to residents of Upper Arlington, which is defined as anyone that lives or works within the City limits. All ticket sales will be conducted online, and sessions can be purchased up to seven days in advance, beginning at Noon each day. For more information, please contact the pools.

Community Center Feasibility Task Force (CCFTF) Update

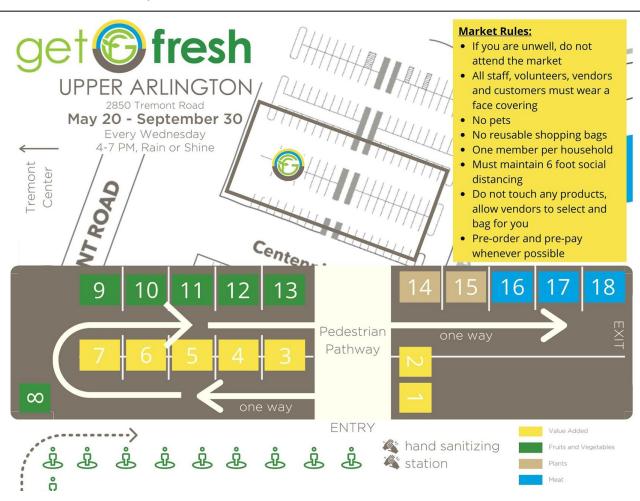
The CCFTF presented their key findings to date with City Council on June 29, 2020. This represents the conclusion of Phase I of the study (What kind of community center makes sense for Upper Arlington? Do we want a community center? Do we need community center?). The Task Force members offered consensus on moving forward with Phase II of the study (second phase drills into the details, such as what facilities to include, where a community center might be located, and the costs for construction, operations and ongoing maintenance). The Task Force has also indicated that they intend to include additional public outreach and another survey in Phase II to help gauge how residents thoughts on the Community Center may have changed due to COVID-19. They will be taking a brief pause while people continue to adjust to the impacts of COVID-19 and hope to resume the study late summer into fall. Upper Arlington Library Contactless Curbside Pick Up of Holds

The Upper Arlington Main Library at 2800 Tremont Road is offering contactless curbside pick up of holds. Patrons may place requests through their catalog or by calling 614-486-9621. Once the item is ready, they'll notify the patron. Items can be picked up Monday-Friday from 10 am-6 pm, and Saturday from 10 am-4 pm with no appointment necessary. The Main Library's book drops are open for returns Monday-Friday from 1 pm-6 pm. The Lane Road and Miller Park libraries are temporarily closed.

2020 Get Fresh Upper Arlington Farmers Market

The Get Fresh Upper Arlington Farmers Market is open on Wednesdays from 4-7 pm at the Tremont Pool parking lot adjacent to Northam Park (2850 Tremont Road, Upper Arlington, 43221). In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, this year's Farmers Market will operate differently than in previous years, by implementing logistical adjustments to ensure the health and safety of its staff, vendors and the community at large. Each week the first 30 minutes of the Market will be reserved for seniors and residents who are immunocompromised.
