

Music in the Parks



Music in the Parks brings a diverse and accessible summer concert series to Upper Arlington that provides a space for families and friends to come together to share performing art and culture experiences.

- Thursday evenings in June and July
- Locations include Sunny 95 Park, Thompson Park and Mallway Park
- Food trucks at each concert
- Over 50 bands apply to perform in this series every year
- A jury of staff and community members meet to score and select bands to perform, bringing the community the best in live music.

- Any individual artist or artisan that creates a product by hand and lives and/or works in UA can apply
- Any business in UA that sells handmade products can apply
- All work must be original, handcrafted. Buy/sell kits, imports, commercial and mass-produced items will not be accepted
- Artists/Artisans must have a transient Vendor's License from the State of Ohio
- Vendors are responsible for their own 10'x10' tents, tables, chairs and displays. Tents MUST be anchored by at least 25 pounds on each leg
- \$50 booth space fee is due upon completion of application
- 3 images of work and 1 booth space image required

Additional Criteria

- Display and merchandise must stay within the assigned 10'x10' space
- No electricity provided
- No more than 2 artists may share one booth space
- The artist, artisan or business owner/representative should be present for the entire event
- Vendors are expected to have enough product to support all the open hours of the event
- All vendors must stay open for the entire event

Upper Arlington Labor Day Arts Festival





The Upper Arlington Labor Day Arts Festival celebrates and shares the arts with the community and region within a beautiful park setting. Each year, more than 20,000 visitors flock to Northam Park on Labor Day to immerse themselves in hands-on art activities, interactive performances, live music, and the opportunity to explore and purchase fine art and fine craft work from some 120 artists working in a variety of media including paintings, photography, jewelry, pottery, sculptures and mixed media.

Upper Arlington Labor Day Arts Festival



History

The art show, first held in 1966, was organized by local artists including Don Dodrill and was held in local parks like Miller Park and the Mallway. The art show then moved to the Municipal Services Center on Tremont Road and upon further expansion, moved to Northam Park in 1986. The Cultural Arts Division has produced this event since 1983. The festival has grown in size to now accommodate over 120 artists, vendors, activity areas, and performances.

- Artists should apply through Zapplication
- Individual Fine Art and Fine Craft artists can apply
- Artists working in more than one category of work may apply under the same name with a maximum of three mediums
- Artists working in the same studio and using the same studio name may request to exhibit in the same booth for one booth fee, with a maximum of three artists
- The Festival jury is conducted by a panel of four experienced arts and industry professionals as well as one Cultural Arts Commissioner

Jury Process

- Blind Jury The jurors do not know the name or any identifying factors about the artist. Images should NOT include the name or face of the artist or the studio name
- Judging is based on the quality of work illustrated in the submitted digital images. 3 high quality images of work and one booth image
- Accepted artists will be the top/highest scores in respective mediums

OIL PAINTINGS

LDAF — Rules/Regulations

Rules/Regulations

- All work must be the original, hand-produced work of the artist and representative of the work submitted in the applications.
- Items not accepted include kit work, manufactured items, molded ceramics (unless molds are designed by the artist), dried flower arrangements, live plant material or trees, commercial photography, "buy/sell" items, prepared foods or work produced by anyone other than the applying artist.
- Each artist must be present at the event.
- The UA Arts Festival does not take a percentage of artists' profits. The artist handles all sales


LDAF - Jewelry Application Example

Artist Statement

ECO Jewelry is the art of transforming natural products like seeds & nuts into beautiful, vibrant, colorful & environmentally friendly jewelry. The most common products used are Tagua and Bombona nuts and Acai and Huayruro seeds. Nuts are either carved or sliced, depending on the design. Seeds are limited to dying and drilling due mainly to their size. Both materials can be dyed and polished. Only after these steps are completed, assembly based on a design will follow.

LDAF - Wood Application Example

This trio of footed bowls was made from local Ohio woods - cherry and walnut. The bowls themselves were from the same piece of wood and without the foot, would nest within each other. The walnut foot adds a beautiful contrast to each piece.

This is a box elder, winged bowl. The edge of the wing has the natural bark from the piece. The bowl itself appears to be penetrating the wing as the sides remain aligned from top to bottom.

Segmented candlesticks made of bloodwood and yellow heart. The actual candle portion is a metal insert to protect the wood. When viewed from the proper angle, one can see through the body of the candlestick. Sold as a pair.

Artist Statement

All the work I produce consists primarily of wood components, while other materials such as Corian and metal may be used for functionality and/or accents. I find the natural beauty in the wood and include burls and knots as Mother Nature included them in her work. Through the process of segmenting, I can use multiple species of wood. The gives me a natural color palette as no stains are added. All the pieces have durable finishes on them, and many of the bowls are designated as food safe



Through the variety of arts programming provided, the Concourse Gallery is a vital and active resource for the community, raising awareness, accessibility and advancement for the arts.

Concourse Gallery - Goals



- Provide opportunities for emerging and established artists to exhibit their work in a community focused space through a formal jury process
- Broaden the community's exposure to different types of art, artists and culture
- Provide an inclusive, accessible and educational space where visitors feel comfortable and welcomed
- Increase exposure for established artists by displaying artwork for at least two months
- Increase attendance to exhibits by promoting through social media, e-newsletters and publications
- Develop a comprehensive Gallery Guide for each exhibit that educates and inspires attendees
- Create fun experiences to engage with art to draw people in that wouldn't normally explore a gallery or museum

Arlington Gallery - Goals




- Provide opportunities for Upper Arlington artists to exhibit their work in a smaller and non-juried setting

- Rotate artwork every one to two months


